Married at 20, she had 50 years of happiness with him, raising two boys and two girls, continuing with her piano by taking lessons and teaching piano to many children in the Bay area.

After Nixon opened relations with China, she and her children were able to visit and meet all their relatives on both sides. It was an amazing experience for her children and she has returned three times, witnessing the many changes there.

One fateful day, when Louise lived in the Bay Area, invited to substitute as a partner in a duplicate bridge game, she and her partner came in first. Louise was hooked!

Thirty years ago, when she and her husband retired to Los Osos, she became involved with the newly starting Morro Bay Charity Club and directed it until she was 80.
