AFTER THE WAR SHE MET IVAN AT UCLA AND THEY MARRIED IN 1946 AND LIVED FOR A SHORT TIME IN HAWAII.

IN 1970 THEY MOVED TO CAYUCOS AND IVAN WORKED AT DIABLO CANYON. PATRICIA STILL LIVES IN CAYUCOS.
