IN 1976 CONSTRUCTION WORK SLOWED DOWN AND HE BEGAN INVESTING IN REAL ESTATE MANAGING HIS OWN PROPERTIES.

IN 1992, HE AND HIS WIFE DIVORCED AND HE BEGAN TRAVELLING IN HIS MOBILE HOME.

LONELY, HE REMEMBERED ONE OF HIS TENANTS, A TEACHER WHO HAD IMPRESSED HIM, SO HE ASKED HER OUT TO DINNER. AFTER THEIR MARRIAGE, THEY TRAVELLED TOGETHER COAST TO COAST AND INTO CANADA AND MEXICO.

RON AND JUDI MOVED TO ARROYO GRANDE A YEAR AGO AND ARE BEGINNING TO FEEL AT HOME.

AS FOR HIS BRIDGE EXPERIENCE, RON PLAYED HIS FIRST GAME AT THE AGE OF 74. HE HAD A WONDERFUL MENTOR, A MASTER PLAYER FROM EDMONTON, ALBERTA WHO WAS HIS PARTNER FOR TWO AND A HALF YEARS.
